### **4 Stanford Projects Fiscal Studies**

On June 25, 2008, the Planning & Transportation Commission will discuss the parameters of the fiscal analysis being prepared for the Stanford University Medical Center and the Stanford Shopping Center projects. The fiscal analysis will include estimates of potential revenue and secondary economic benefits of the projects. The analysis will also include likely project impacts on City services and indirect impacts on the City and area economy. The fiscal analysis is expected to be in draft form at about the same time that the Environmental Impact Report draft is released (estimated in November). The City Council will also discuss this topic at a study session on July 14, 2008. The project applications and other information may be viewed

### **Summer Program In-Service Training Completed**

In preparation for a great summer, Community Services Department program staff received training in first aid, CPR, customer service, leadership, decision making, problem solving, program development and rescue skills. The summer staff completed its week long Summer In-Service Training this week. Approximately 200 camp counselors, swim instructors, lifeguards, counselors-in-training and junior lifeguards participated.
