Hearing Procedures

Please be advised the normal order of agenda items is as follows:

- *Hearing Officer announces agenda item and requests input from staff and applicants*
- *Hearing Officer asks for public comment on the item – each speaker should limit their comments to approximately five (5) minutes, and please do not repeat comments made by previous speakers but rather, acknowledge your support of that comment.*
- *Hearing Officer asks applicant and staff for any clarification and closing comments*
- *Hearing Officer will close the public comments portion and either continue to the item to a date certain or date uncertain or conclude the hearing on the item*
- *Director's decision on items for which the hearing is concluded will be posted at the Downtown Library ten working days from the Director's Hearing date.*

NEW BUSINESS:

4155 Old Adobe Road: Director's Hearing regarding Jaim Nulman and Avelyn Welczer application for a permit to demolish a single family residence. This hearing is being conducted pursuant to a judgment in the case entitled Jaim Nulman and Avelyn Welczer v. City of Palo Alto entered on January 29, 2007. Environmental Assessment: Exempt from the provisions of CEQA, Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(1). Zone District: R-1

Appeals

The appeal period is fourteen calendar days following the mailing of the Director's Decision. Appeal forms and a fee must be submitted to planning staff at the Development Center during business hours. Appeals filed after 4 pm must be submitted to staff on the 5th floor of City Hall, 250 Hamilton Avenue.

If you wish to appeal any item on this agenda, contact the Planning Division (329-2441) regarding time and fee. If you challenge this land use decision in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Palo Alto, at or prior to the public hearing.
