- forwarded to members in the community.
- Mr. Aram James said that the task force meetings should fall under the rules of the Brown Act so that members of the public are allowed to attend.
- Ms. Stephanie Munoz asked the HRC to get involved in homeless issues.
- Mr. Cary-Andrew Crittendon spoke about equal access and equal protection in the constitution and how homeless are denied equal access.
- Ms. Mila Zelkha provided history of the Task Force for members of the public. It was not organized by the City and began as a collaboration among homeless provider agencies, with participation of
- city staff.
