What is Law Enforcement Exploring?

Law Enforcement Exploring, a division of Learning for Life, is a volunteer career education program for young men and women interested in law enforcement. In partnership with the Palo Alto Police Department, Explorers will receive training and education in various aspects of police work, such as criminal law, CSI, first aid, traffic enforcement, patrol procedures, and more...

Explorer Activities

Explorers will participate in regular meetings consisting of a mix of classroom training and hands-on application of learned skills. Explorers will be expected to attend the local Police Explorer Academy to learn the fundamentals of police work.

Explorers will have opportunities to provide community services during public events such as traffic/crowd control, search and rescue, natural disaster response, and more (as appropriate to the position). Explorers may also perform volunteer services at Department and participate as role-players in training exercises. Sworn Police Officers will supervise Explorers at all events. The Explorer Post will also organize social activities not related to law enforcement for fun and team development. Explorers will also have first-hand opportunities to experience police work through a structured ride-along program.

Qualifications

To be eligible, Explorers must:

- Be at least 14 years old, but not yet 21 years old
- Have and maintain a 2.0 GPA or better
- Be able and willing to attend all meetings (2 hours each, 2 per month)
- Pass a background check and interview
- Purchase part of your own uniform (some financial assistance may be available)

Explorers are also **required** to attend the regional Explorer Academy (9 consecutive weekends – Sunday or Saturday – in Fall or Winter) to learn the fundamentals of police work and gain leadership experience. The Explorer Academy is a prerequisite to some other activities and promotion.
