
INTRODUCTIONS

PROJECT HISTORY



- The Charleston-Arastradero Corridor is a heavily used, 2.3mile residential arterial serving as an east-west connector for the southern section of Palo Alto
- The corridor services schools, parks, shopping centers, community centers, senior living facilities, and a library
- The project has been under development for nearly 20 years with significant stakeholder outreach and community engagement to develop the concept plan line approved in 2015

PROJECT HISTORY



- The project is divided into three phases to meet grant funding deadlines and minimize construction disruption:
 - Phase 1 (completed November 2020): Arastradero Road from Miranda Avenue to Clemo Avenue
 - Phase 2 (completed November 2020): East Charleston Road from Alma Street to Middlefield Road
 - Phase 3






PHASE 3 PROJECT LIMITS

- Arastradero Road
 - Los Palos Avenue to El Camino Real
- West Charleston Road
 - El Camino Real to Alma Street
- East Charleston Road
 - Small portion in front of Hoover Elementary School not captured in Phase 2
 - Nelson Drive to San Antonio Road




PHASE 3 PROJECT MAP

SCOPE OF CONSTRUCTION

- Construction and landscaping of medians and curb extensions
- Widening of sidewalks and bike paths
- ADA compliant curb ramps
- Traffic signal modifications and upgrades
- Replacement of pavement striping and markings
- Resurfacing of Arastradero and Charleston Roads



IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES

• Temporary measures in the form of white and pink spray paint and straw wattles will be installed 4 weeks prior to the start of construction work











IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES AT EL CAMINO

- Continuous bike lane across El Camino
- Stamped colored crosswalks






- Removal of pork chop island and addition of raised crosswalk at the southwest corner
- Curb extensions at the northeast and southeast corners





IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES AT MIDDLEFIELD


- Dedicated right-turn lanes in both directions
- Continuous bike lane across Middlefield
- Eastbound bike lane to be restriped to allow bicyclists to maintain a straight path through the intersection





IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES AT LOUIS/MONTROSE

- New traffic signal
- Bike lanes installed on Louis and Montrose
- Larger median refuge islands for bicyclists
- High visibility crosswalks in all 4 directions
- Curb extensions at all 4 corners






IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES AT LOUIS/MONTROSE





IMPROVEMENTS AND FEATURES AT FABIAN

- Dedicated left turn lane for vehicles and left turn bike box for bicyclists in the eastbound direction
- New crosswalk on the east side of the intersection
- Bike lanes installed on Charleston east of Fabian Way in both directions



Grant Objectives and Requirements

- Improve bicycle facilities on 3 segments
 - Waverley Multi-Use Path
 - Fabian Way
 - East Meadow Drive
- Protected bicycle facilities
- Obligate by January 31, 2023

Preferred Design – Widen Path on Either Side







Fabian Way

Door Zone


Between East Meadow Circle & Fabian Way

East Meadow Drive looking east, away from Fabian Way







Between Alma Street & Waverley Street

East Meadow Drive looking east at Ramona Street







Between Waverley Street & Middlefield Road

Preferred Design - Protected Bike Lane and Buffered Bike Lane with Parking












Adjacent to Fairmeadow Elementary School

Preferred Design - Protected Bike Lane and Buffered Bike Lane with Parking












Between Middlefield Road & East Meadow Circle

Preferred Design – Traffic Calming: Travel Lane Width Reduction and Bike Lane Visibility Treatments









Next Steps

- Fall RFP to Initiate Design Phase
 - Perform detailed traffic and parking studies
 - Engage community on desired types of bikeway separation, parking reconfiguration, and other design options
 - Implement temporary treatments
