The City of Palo Alto is committed to improving access to high-quality housing for residents to meet the needs of the entire community. The City has the second highest inventory of affordable housing as a percentage of total housing stock relative to other incorporated jurisdictions in Santa Clara County.*

- On April 15, 2024 City
 Council approved the Revised
 2023-2031 Housing Element
- \$52 million contributed or pledged towards affordable housing since 2017
- Approximately 2,300 units or ~9% of total housing stock dedicated to affordable housing (deed restricted)
- Over 1,000 housing units permitted in the last eight years

RENTER PROTECTIONS WERE EXPANDED IN 2023:

- Just cause eviction ordinance
- Lower security deposit limit for unfurnished rental units
- Less time for renters to live in a property to qualify for protections
